

Opening Game/Thought

Psychiatrist - have one person leave the room. The remaining people will decide one person in their group that everyone will act, speak, and behave like. Once you've decided who in your group you're all going to act like, and once you feel prepared enough, call the other person back in. That person, who is the Psychiatrist, will then ask questions and try to get behavioral responses from the group, trying to guess who everyone is acting like.

Tip: if you don't know how to respond to the Psychiatrist, fall asleep for 5 seconds then wake back up!

Play a few rounds, switching up who the Psychiatrist is!

Usually when someone is behaving differently than who they are, it's a red flag that something is wrong. Throughout the gospels, we encounter Jesus in places and people that He shouldn't be: in gatherings of people, the waters of baptism, bread and wine, and today we see Jesus in people who seemed to be rejected by society. With normal people behaving like others, it's wrong, but this truth of Jesus' presence is something we celebrate!

Matthew 25:34-40
